



Space Dyed Yarns

Understanding the Space Dyed Yarn and How it will Knit:

- Space dyed yarn is one continuous length of yarn, dyed in random increments using 4 different colors
- Because it is one yarn, it only “counts” as one color position within a design, even though it knits as a range of colors
- How the colors appear within a bed scarf, blanket, throw or pillow is organic, making each piece different and unique in its own way
- Due to the random nature of the colors in a space dyed yarn, patterns may organically appear as a piece knits
- The space dyed yarn is an uncontrollable variable and cannot be manipulated or specified to knit in a specific way

Tips on How to Use and Not Use the Space Dyed Yarns:

- Do's:
 - Most effectively as an accent, used in small areas
 - Larger areas of space dyed yarns should be broken up by using other colors
 - The yarns look best when they are partnered with complimentary colors
 - Work well in a range of pattern types like geometrics, stripes, plaids, organic, and subtle ombre designs
- Don'ts
 - Do not use in large, unobstructed areas; this can be visually overbearing
 - Does not look good with highly-contrasting colors
 - Patterns can't be too chaotic or random; the design needs some semblance of structure
